## FACE LIFT FOR CHURCH CLOCK

Thanks to Parish Council funding, work is underway to restore the faces of the Church clock to their former glory. Next in line for an overhaul are the trees in the Churchyard. The Parish Council has planning permission and a budget set aside to carry out maintenance work on them.

The Parish Council are purchasing new litter bins to be placed at strategic points round the village. The aim is not only to keep the streets clear of litter, but also to help tackle the problem of dog fouling by making it easier for owners to clean up. This is just the first measure in a concerted campaign by the Council to tackle this anti-social behaviour, which we know is a very important issue to our Parishioners.
